

Disneyland ITINERARY

MORNING

- Start in Fantasyland: Dumbo, Alice, Carousel, Casey Jr., Teacups. Crowds are light and characters are often out.
- Snack at Maurice's Treats.
- Meet princesses at Royal Hall (usually opens at 10:15 am—check the app).

LATE MORNING/LUNCH

- Head to Adventureland: Jungle Cruise and Pirates (typically under 25 minutes).
- Let kids explore the Adventureland Treehouse.
- Ride Winnie the Pooh before lunch.
- Eat at Hungry Bear Barbeque (kid-friendly) or head to New Orleans Square for more variety.

MIDDAY OPTIONS

- Hotel Break: If kids need real naps, head back now.
- Stroller Nap: Explore Galaxy's Edge, stroller-friendly with lots to see. Grab a Black Caf coffee at Docking Bay 7.
- No Nap but Need a Break: Catch the Tiki Room show or visit Pirate's Lair on Tom Sawyer Island.

AFTERNOON

- Head to Tomorrowland: Astro Orbiter, Autopia, or Toy Story if the wait is under 30 minutes. Parents can trade off single rider for Space Mountain.
- Take the Disneyland Railroad to ToonTown.

TOONTOWN

- Explore play areas, meet characters, and ride family attractions.
- If the line is reasonable, do Mickey and Minnie's Runaway Railway—the queue is very entertaining.

EVENING

- Dinner and Parade:
 - Option 1: Eat dinner first, then grab a spot near It's a Small World.
 - Option 2: Put down a blanket early, send one parent for dinner, and eat while waiting.
- Fireworks if kids can stay awake—otherwise, end the night after the parade with happy but tired little ones.
